When Ketan Mehta directed the 1993 film Sarajit featuring Parash Ramal in titular character, the world came to know a lot about this great legendary freedom fighter and his efforts to build an independent India.Sarajit (2016)Sarajit is a 2013 biographical film based on the life of human rights activist and lawyer Shaibal Azmi, who was eventually murdered in Mumbai in 2010. Directed by Hansal Mehta, the film features Rajkumar Rao in the titular character. Reakee Reakee Azmi also defended the 2004 film Black Friday, while fighting for a release against the Censor board, and the act influenced Anurag Kashyap to make a film about the life.
